In your essay you *must*.


- Discuss the events leading to Japan opening up to the West.

### The Thesis statement

The Thesis is probably the most important part of your essay. A clear thesis should give you a good understanding of what you must write in the rest of your essay. Look at the thesis chart at the bottom to understand what you must do for your thesis. (You will need the documents from worksheet #1 to write your thesis- **so take it out!**)

## Closing

There are two three ways to end your essay. In order from easy to difficult:

- You can summarize what you wrote (lower-level skill)
- You can mention something that came later or after the topic you discussed (but still related to the topic you discussed). For example, if the essay was on Napoleon, you could end it by discussing the Congress of Vienna, which was created as a result of Napoleon (mid-level skill)
- You can discuss a historical "lesson learned" from the essay subject. For example, (Scientific Revolution) "By learning to think independently without reliance upon the Church, scientists have been free to make discoveries that resulted in our advanced society today."
